How it works

Once you register for the one-week BAM Certificate at Tyndale, you will experience a five-day journey with a cohort of emerging leaders.

Day 1. Develop your understanding of leadership. Examine your assumptions about leadership and develop a theology of leadership you can apply to the BAM mission and your own goals.

Day 2. Know yourself as a leader. With expert guest instructors, assessment tools and group discussion, frame your personal values from a biblical perspective and gain a deeper emotional and spiritual intelligence.

Day 3. Gain intercultural competence. Develop key intercultural competencies based on an intercultural perspective with an intercultural competence specialist.

Day 4. Tackle ethical dilemmas in 21st century leadership. Under the guidance of a global ethics expert, examine the major perspectives on ethics today and what a redemptive ethic looks like in your setting. Wrestle with New Testament passages and real case studies.

Day 5. Discover how you can lead missionally in the midst of complexity and change. With reflective exercises and group activity, examine how dynamics of change affect churches, families and organizations. Apply systems thinking to BAM's and your leadership setting so that you can facilitate emergent change.

Apply your learning in a collaborative project. Work in a team throughout the course to develop and present a relevant action learning project.
